London Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make sure that their workers are trained to work proficiently utilizing telehandler equipment. The personnel need to be assessed for their ability to use the machinery. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that staff get the necessary level of skill. The responsibility level of the individual needs to be considered when training is provided. Effective training will solve whatever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training can be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment upon completing the training period would determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Federal, state/provincial and local rules set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, the use of rotating equipment or making use of other attachments. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

Like any equipment, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machine inevitably will suffer wear over time. Proper maintenance is important to ensuring safe use of the telehandler equipment. Checks and inspections are vital to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to prevent, rectify and monitor problems connected with wear, deterioration and damage. Staff require competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer must be viewed seriously and followed, taking into account such factors as environmental conditions in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the equipment along with the owner of the machine share the responsibility for making sure that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use inspections are usually done by the user, while general maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner.
